The map is a comprehensive and complete digital document covering all aspects of drainage-sewerage system of Peshawar. The map would be a helping and guiding tool in overcoming shortcomings and problems in sewerage system besides a base for future planning and managing the sewerage system. Efforts made by WSSP's engineers, sub-engineers and support

from KPCIP GIS specialist are applaudable. Now we are developing a GIS map of water supply system. To improve service delivery, shorten repair period of operational vehicles, and increase recovery, the management is bringing some administrative changes in daily operations. Solid waste staff has to help in recovery for solid waste management like water supply staff. A comprehensive plan is being implemented for immediately repair and maintenance of operational vehicles. To reduce the burden of solid waste and reuse different items found in solid waste at domestic level, WSSP

outreach teams are encouraging and guiding girl students for converting different items into decoration pieces and household women for segregation. Besides, we are considering different options to make solid waste a source of income, for this, a few rounds of talks have been held with an industrial unit and very soon we will achieve another significant milestone. Our focus is not limited to improvement in services delivery, recovery and administration, we also encourage employees for best performance which leads to a positive competition. Let's help each other for a cleaner and healthier Peshawar.

WSSP PREPARES GIS-BASED MAP OF DRAINAGE SYSTEM

Water and Sanitation Services Peshawar (WSSP) has achieved a significant milestone by preparing the first-ever comprehensive digital (GIS-based) map of Peshawar's drainage-sewerage system. The map covers all details, including the length, width, depth, starting and ending points, areas, union councils, and connections to natural water channels within WSSP's jurisdiction. Engineers and sub-engineers of WSSP collected the data, which was transferred to Arc GIS Software with the assistance of GIS experts from the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Cities Improvement Project (KPCIP). The map serves as a foundational and comprehensive resource for planning and monitoring the drainage system. The overall drainage system spans 1,862 kilometers, comprising 17,480 small and large drains within WSSP's jurisdiction, including 14 primary drains, 692 secondary drains, and 16,774 tertiary drains. The total length of tertiary drains is 1,419.97 kilometers, secondary 383.38 kilometers, and primary

11 More Model Streets Developed



Citizen Liaison Cell (CLC) conducted 37 awareness sessions and reached 982 beneficiaries, distributed more than 500 pamphlets. 11 more model streets were developed with the help of community-three in Zone A, five in Zone B, one in Zone D and two in Zone E. While three

undesigned points eradicated one in Zone A and two in Zone B. To enhance revenue CLC teams held seven meetings with Niebuhr hood Council Chairmen and WASH Committee Members besides resolving a conflict regarding bill payment.
