

CEO'S MESSAGE

WSSP's journey towards success continues consistently, step-by-step with discipline and without wasting time. Management and staff are active taking steps to climb the ladder of achievements. Being run by a team of highly skilled and experienced professionals, WSSP always looks for innovations to modernize services delivery system; and ingenuity to address the loopholes in the existing one. Whether it is construction of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's first-ever sanitary landfill cell, installation of Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) or water testing devices on our tube-wells, WSSP has now completed a research project by indigenously manufacturing

water testing equipment. The system has been developed by experts of University of Engineering & Technology, Peshawar in close consultation with WSSP. It is another milestone for provision of potable water to the people of Peshawar besides an important one to put brake on water borne diseases. WSSP has formally taken over the system. With the system water quality parameters like temperature, pH, Turbidity, Total Dissolved Solids (TDS)/ Salinity, Resistivity, Electrical Conductivity, Dissolved Oxygen, and Dissolved Carbon Dioxide be tested to ensure that water supplied is safe for consumers. Water



quality is a sensitive matter, WSSP is making all efforts to provide safe drinking water to all consumers, for this, monthly 100 tests are conducted, rusted water distribution pipeline is being replaced gradually alongside close monitoring of the water distribution network. With the new system WSSP will be able to test and check water quality in a short span of time. Physiochemical result will now be ready real time while biological result will be available in seven hours instead of 18 to 24 hours. Alongside quality monitoring and testing WSSP is also taking administrative steps to stop & control contaminating water at the users end. Water is safe at source level; however,

illegal connections are the main cause leading to contamination. Teams are working regularly to bring illegal connections under net, which will not only increase revenue but will control contamination also. WSSP is providing more than 50-million-gallon water daily. Without water there is no life, every citizen must realize and play role to save water, stop wastage, register illegal connection and pay bill on time. WSSP has also engaged religious scholars and elected representatives in sensitizing community to use water and stop wastage. Let's put hands together to preserve water for a better future of the country and coming generations.

Secretary Local Government Visits WSSP



Secretary for Local Government Elections and Rural Development Zafar-ul-Islam visited Water and Sanitation Services Peshawar (WSSP) reviewed the company's mandate, operations, financial and administrative affairs. He also directed that WSSP's dashboard be shared with other WSSCs and TMA through an agreement facilitated by the Local Government Department, which would generate revenue for WSSP.

Advanced Testing System Developed for Water Quality Testing

An advanced testing system has been developed to ensure supply of clean water to consumers. The modern, feature-rich Remote Quality Monitoring and Testing System has been jointly developed by the Center for Intelligent and Network Research, University of Engineering and Technology (UET) Peshawar and WSSP. It is a testament to the innovation and capability of UET Peshawar experts and will eliminate the need to spend

thousands of dollars on importing expensive equipment. The locally developed system was handed over to WSSP CEO Yasir Ali Khan by Dr. Zeeshan Shafiq of Innovative Solutions and Networks Research. GM Operations Muhammad Ijaz, GM Planning Syed Zamir-ul-Hassan, GM Projects Dr. Mehboob Alam, Engineer Musa Khan, and Engineer Adil Shah were present on this occasion. Through this system, water quality can be tested in a short

time with accuracy. Physicochemical test results will be available in real time, while biological tests will take seven hours—which previously took 18-24 hours with imported equipment. The system can detect acidity, temperature, turbidity, total dissolved solids, minerals such as calcium and magnesium, salinity, electrical resistivity and conductivity, dissolved oxygen and carbon dioxide, as well as disease-causing germs and bacteria.

UET experts also trained WSSP water supply managers and water quality staff on system usage. CEO Yasir Ali Khan termed the system significant, stating that every effort is being made to provide consumers with clean, quality drinking water. Daily testing is conducted, and the installation of this system will further improve water quality—an important step toward ensuring safe drinking water for consumers.
