WSSP is taking all step to use energy in an efficient way, for this, an energy management committee has already been formed. Under the supervision of committee, experts are carrying out survey in collaboration with Center for Intelligent Systems and Network Research (CISNR) University of Engineering & Technology Peshawar. WSSP Successfully Completes Eidul Azha Operation

Water and Sanitation Services Peshawar successfully completed the Eidul Azha special sanitation operation. A total of 3,563 personnel took part in the operation, during which offal and remains of sacrificial animals were collected and disposed of using 707 small and large vehicles. On the final day of operation, main roads and collection points across the city were washed with a mixture of Arq-e-Gulab and chlorine, followed by spraying and lime application. Provincial Minister for Local Government Arshad Ayub visited various areas of the city and praised the WSSP staff for ensuring timely cleanliness. Acting Mayor Dr. Muhammad Ismail, chairmen of neighborhood councils, political and social circles, and general public appreciated the Eid operation. Commissioner Peshawar Riaz Khan Mehsud also visited the field and commended the performance of the WSSP staff deployed for Eid sanitation. The operation was supervised by Chief Executive Officer Yasir Ali. During the three-day operation, 14,200 tons of offal and remains of sacrificial animals were collected. Seventeen collection points and five temporary transfer stations were established to collect waste from streets and neighborhoods. A complaint cell



remained active throughout the three days of Eid, receiving more than 400 complaints, all of which were promptly addressed. To ensure safe collection of offal, biodegradable plastic bags were distributed among the public. An awareness campaign was also run using the services of religious scholars and elected representatives. CEO Yasir Ali Khan, GM Operations Muhammad Ijaz, and other senior officials remained present in the field throughout the three days, and the operation was continuously monitored. The offal and remains of animals were disposed of in deep pits in Shamshato, covered with lime, sprayed, and then covered with soil. Drinking water supply was also maintained during all three days. Yasir Ali Khan praised the staff and officials who took part in the operation, stating that the team sacrificed their own Eid to ensure the service and cleanliness for the citizens of Peshawar.

Reviews Eidul Azha Cleanliness Drive



Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Minister for Local Government, Arshad Ayub Khan, visited various areas of Peshawar on the third day of Eidul Azha to review the special cleanliness operation. mance in effectively disposing of animal waste over the three days of Eidul Azha and acknowledged their hard and teamwork. CEO WSSP briefed the Minister in detail regarding the special Eid operation and informed that over 14,000 tons of animal waste had been disposed of during the three days of Eid. He maintained that all main roads were washed with a mixture of Arq-e-Gulab and chlorine, and disinfection spray was carried out to ensure a hygienic and safe environment.

WSSP Management Reviews Progress on Ground Water Mapping Study

The WSSP Management reviewed progress on Ground Water Mapping Study in meeting with Chief Executive Officer Yasir Ali Khan in the chair. Expert from University of Engineering & Technology Peshawar, UNICEF and WSSP officials attended the meeting. WSSP and NIUIP have already inked MoU to Map Ground Water and Aquifer. WSSP and National Institute of Urban Infrastructure, Planning (NIUIP), University of Engineering & Technology Peshawar, are carrying out a joint study on "Ground Water Mapping and Aquifer Assessment in Urban Peshawar", aimed to establish collaboration in the field of water & sanitation for the benefit of society. In the study, assessment of underground water reservoirs is in progress and at the end measures would be proposed to safeguard water quantity and quality while promoting natural recharge methods, identify recharge zones to slow down the depletion of underground water resources.
