Board of Directors Reviews Various Matters



A meeting of the WSSP Board of Directors was held under the chairmanship of Engineer Muhammad Uzair. CEO Yasir Ali Khan, representatives from Local Government, Finance, Planning & Development Departments, and WSSP officials attended the meeting. Our independent directors Sahibzada Saleem ur Rehman, Mrs Tahira Yasmin

and Muhammad Shahid were also present. The meeting reviewed the implementation of decisions made in previous meetings and expressed satisfaction over the progress so far. Additionally, the board was briefed on operational, financial, administrative affairs, and ongoing development projects.

Internal Audit Team Visits Zonal Sites

The Internal Audit Team, comprising Audit Officer Abdullah and Hazrat Bilal, conducted a visit to Zones A, B, C, D & E to review the logbook record of vehicles. The team thoroughly examined the protocols governing logbook maintenance. A detailed audit report was compiled and submitted to CEO for consideration and further directives. The Audit Team also conducted visits to parking yards of Zones A, B, C, D, and E to collect lubricant samples for quality testing, samples were collected from engine oil and submitted to Admin Department for formal quality assessment. Audit officials visited to

various Union Councils (UCs) within Zone B to verify employee attendance record. They also visited various Union Councils as part of the revenue enhancement initiative.



Progress Review Meeting Held

A meeting to review the performance for the month of April was held under the chairmanship of CEO Yasir Ali Khan. General Manager PMER Syed Zamir-ul-Hassan delivered a detailed presentation covering KPI on operational and financial performance. All HoDs including General Manager Operations Muhammad Ijaz, and all zonal

managers were present. The meeting reviewed April's performance indicators and the progress of ongoing projects. The meeting was informed of improvements in revenue recovery, electricity and fuel expenses, and achievement of targets. CEO directed to officials to intensify efforts to meet the goals and ensure timely

implementation of decisions. He emphasized prioritizing the repair and maintenance of water supply system, ensuring stock of tires, daily mechanical sweeping and road washing. He also directed for billing commercial centers and plazas as per the approved tariff and that recovery be initiated accordingly.



ZONE C: DOOR-TO-DOOR Collection Expanded



The scope of door-to-door waste collection has been expanded in Zone C. Following the instructions of CEO Yasir Ali Khan, the zonal management devised and initiated the door-to-door collection plan. Initially, waste was collected from approximately 6% of households in Zone C; which has now increased to 16%. WSSP is gradually expanding door-to-door collection to prevent unauthorized dumping. Zone C has been assigned the task of implementing door-to-door collection across its entire area. The initiative now covers the entire University Road and all seven union councils within the zone, with a goal to collect waste from 100% of households in the coming weeks. It is worth noting that WSSP already collects waste in different areas of the five zones.

WSSP Starts Installation of RPC Manhole Covers

Water and Sanitation Services Peshawar always thrives for innovation and economical solution. Theft of manhole covers is a national issue and Peshawar is no exception to this menace. Iron grates are frequently stolen and sold at reasonable return. CCTV footages and raids revealed that mostly drug addicts and habitual thieves were involved in it. Many incidents were reported to police but thieves

successfully outflank. Therefore, an engineering solution was imperative. Few years back WSSP focused on adopting manhole covers made of reinforced concrete cement (RCC) but it was not sufficient to deter the thieves. They resorted to breaking 3 feet slab in search of few steel bars to be sold in the market. Now WSSP is introducing innovative material which has strength and no salvage value.

Reinforced Polymer Composite (RPC) are materials created by a polymer matrix with reinforcing fibres. WSSP has procured RPC manhole covers and have successfully installed those at many locations. Introduction of manhole covers made of RPC will go a long way in deterring theft and ensuring covered manholes in the city. This will not only improve the outlook of city but ensure

safety of pedestrians and vehicles.

WSSP prepares and implements the Dengue Action Plan each year, starting anti-dengue spray operations in March, which continue until November. Although dengue control is not directly WSSP's responsibility, yet WSSP cooperates with the Health Department and District Administration in line with

government directives. WSSP staff is also placed at disposal of Health Department and District Administration for anti-dengue activities.
